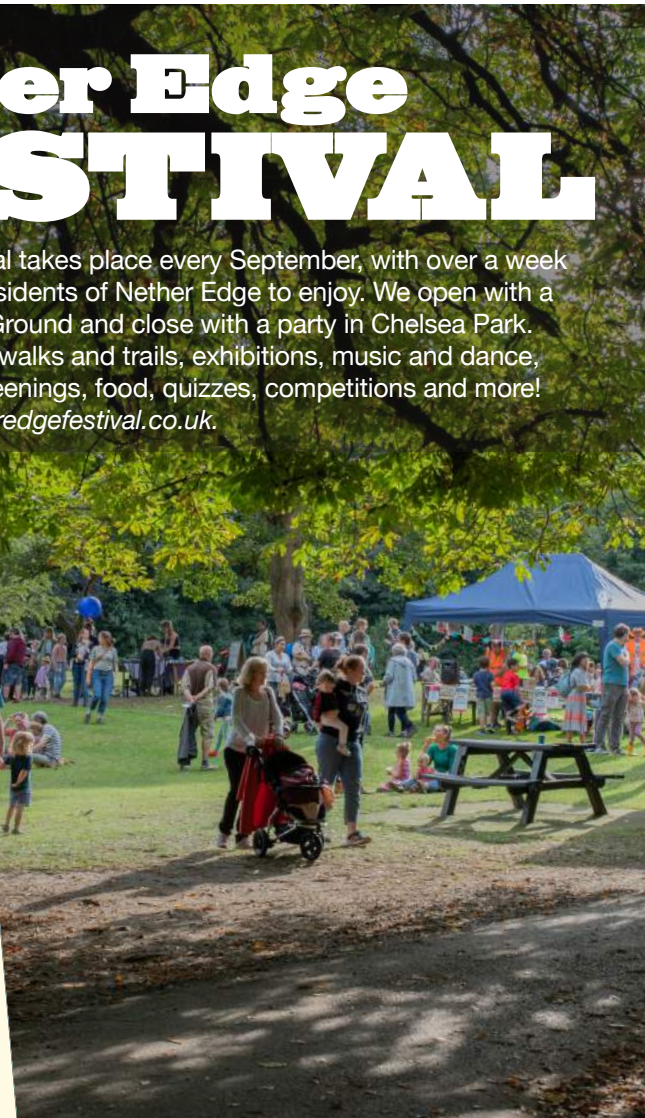
A quarterly Nether Edge Farmers' MARKET

We welcome New Members with some experience although not essential.

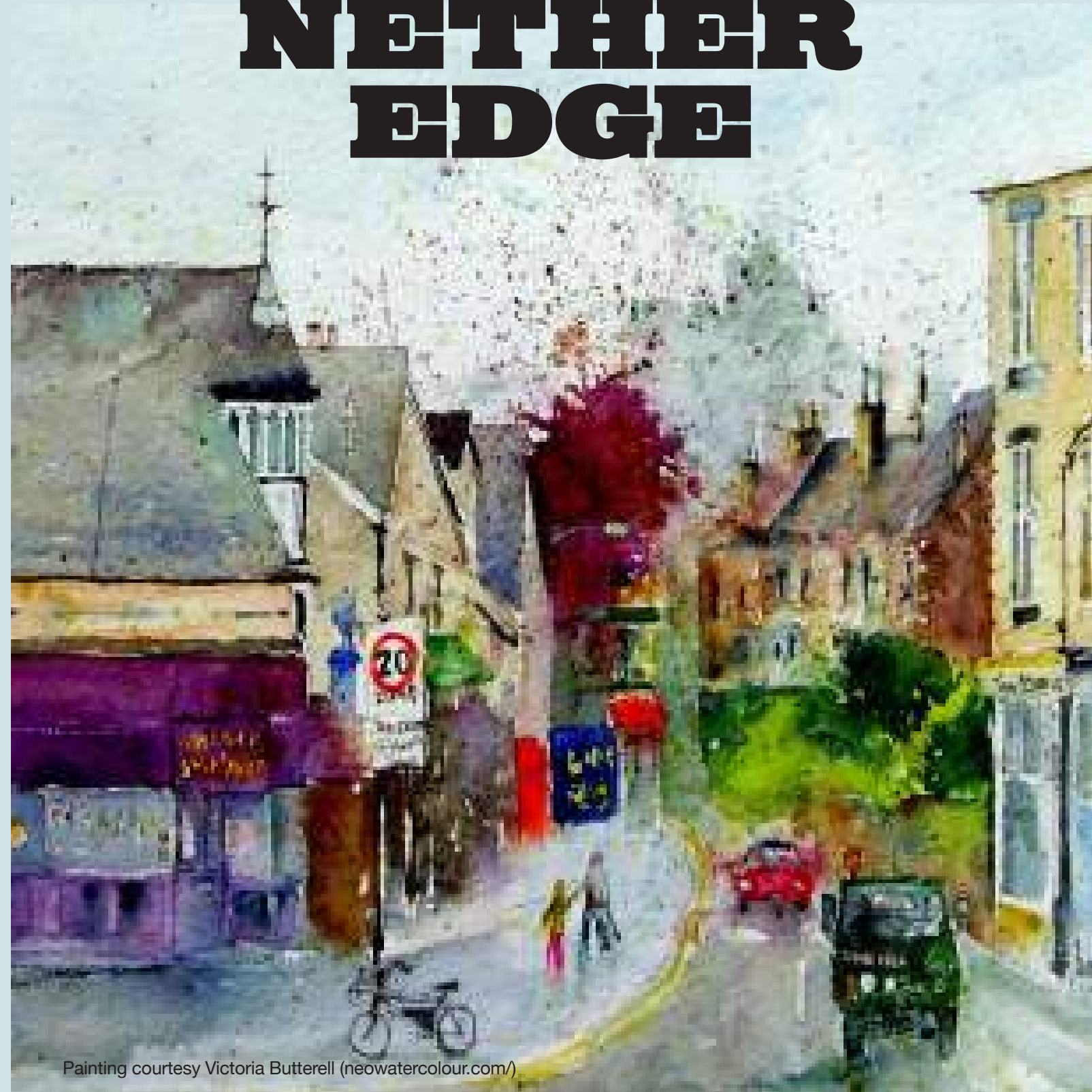
