Wed 1st April. Seamus Org an Irish singer songwriter hailing from Carrickfergus, N Ireland.

Thur 2nd April. A.D. Scruffs is an Americana, Folk and Roots Trio from Bristol, combining unique storytelling with a captivating stage presence.

Fri 3rd April. Internationally acclaimed songwriter **Harry Bird** draws on his own British folk roots and his performances are an intimate cabaret of song, narrative and humour and often raucous crowd participation.

Sun 5th April. A chance to witness another mind blowing performance from the insanely talented classical pianist **Hyuk Namkoong** who was born in South Korea and has won international piano awards.

Tue 7th April. The Horsenecks are Gabrielle Macrae and Barry Southern. Based in Astoria, Oregon, they are two multi-instrumentalists whose music includes early Appalachian fiddle and banjo music, country, classic bluegrass and original folk.

Wed 8th April. Ma Polaine's

Decline has a sound that is their own. Beth and Clinton grew up on jazz, blues and soul, their songs are simultaneously dark and light and very individual.

Thur 9th April. Dani Larkin from the Armagh-Monaghan border is a singer-songwriter and folk musician who is being hailed as one of Ireland's finest songwriters.

Fri 10th and Sat 11th April. The 20ft Squid Blues Band. Another damn fine evening lined up with Sheffield's premier up beat irreverent blues outfit, mixing elements of the Chicago style with a broader take on the blues tradition.

Sun 12th April. William Jack is a multi-style cellist, guitarist and songwriter from South Australia. His music transitions seamlessly from virtuosic folk/bluegrass compositions to non-Western sound worlds.

Mon 13th April. An evening of poetry music with **Gabriel Moreno** who is known for powerful performances and endless streams of passion.

Tue 14th April. Amy LaVere from Memphis, performs sultry touch songs with evocative lyrics and fluid upright bass playing.

Wed 15th April. Robbie Cavanagh performs melodic, haunting yet beautiful music, combining his intricate guitar playing with powerful, emotive lyrics.

Thur 16th April. Suzie Ungerleider is a Canadian alt-country performer with a taste for stark haunting balladry. The timeless themes of love, loss and longing are expressed in soaring melodies and vivid lyrics.

Fri 17th April. Will Finn and Rosie Calvert are a dynamic up-and-coming duo playing traditional music with contemporary flare.

Sat 18th and Sun 19th April. Sarah Jane Scouten from Montreal is a songwriter faithful to the bluegrass and old time folk tradition but not afraid to tackle hard modern themes.

Tue 21st April. Joose Keskitalo is regarded as one of the most original contemporary singer-songwriters in Finland.

Wed 22nd April. When **Ida Wenoe and Samantha Whates** take to the stage together, it's not your typical double headline show, they weave their performances into something more collaborative and unexpected.

Fri 24th April. Joe Martin a Lancashire born singer-songwriter is a modern day troubadour who is deservedly gaining attention on both sides of the Atlantic

Sat 25th April. M.G. Boulter is a songwriter and musician who currently lives on the outer reaches of the Thames coast. As a player of an array of stringed instruments, M.G. Boulter has also worked alongside many other artists and is a long standing member of the Simone Felice Group. Tickets £19.30.

Wed 29th April. An evening with the **Ruth Eliza Trio** who include Ruth Eliza, Matthew Ord and Tom Kimber (banjo, guitar and mandolin). Ruth is a clawhammer banjo player and singer-songwriter based in Lancashire.
