Sun 1st Feb. Chris Murphy an American musician, violinist, bandleader and composer who combines jazz, blues, country, classical and electronic in his music.

Mon 2nd Feb. Joe H Henry a Red River Metis singer-songwriter whose voice is described as "as powerful as a freight train" that delivers his blend of early rhythm and blues, soul and alt-country.



Wed 4th Feb. Letitia Van Sant, David McKindley-Ward. Letitia's lyrics are at once personally and politically relevant and her distinct voice is fortified by sparse indie folk and Americana arrangements.

Thur 5th and Fri 6th Feb. Critically acclaimed singer, songwriter and guitarist **Josienne Clarke** presents her new album 'Far from Nowhere'.

Sat 7th Feb. Brooks Williams is lauded as one of the top 100 acoustic guitarists of all time. Brooks is a brilliant guitarist and singer/songwriter from Boston, USA.

Sun 8th Feb. Lizzie Morris and Dan Watson are a young Barnsley folk duo who've taken the old formula of a folk duo and breathed new life into it.

Wed 11th Feb. Nicola Cipriani and Brad Myrick are an international guitar duo (Italy & USA) whose concerts turn two guitars into an orchestra of sound.

Thur 12th Feb. Gwilym Bowen Rhys has established himself as a worthy ambassador for Welsh language and was nominated for the Folk Singer of the year by BBC Radio 2.

Fri 13th Feb. Miguel Girão originally from the Portuguese Midlands and now based in Glasgow is described as, "one of the most technically gifted and expressive guitarists in Scotland."

Sat 14th Feb. For the loved and the lonely, bachelors, widows, crushes, soulmates, heartbreakers and heartbroken, **Heneghan** invites you to an evening of love songs.

Sun 15th Feb. Georgia Shackleton and Aaron Bennett. Georgia works with fiddle, voice and tenor guitar and drones to create crisp arrangements of old songs and new compositions.

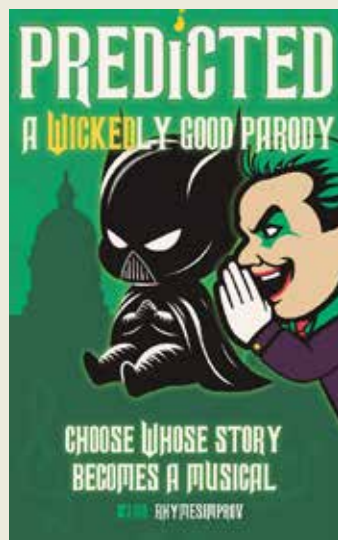
