Tue 12th May. Born of African-Caribbean descent in Quebec, **Kaia Kater** grew up between two worlds; one her family's deep ties to Canadian folk and the other her study of Appalachian music in West Virginia.

Wed 13th May. Jason McNiff plays laid back acoustic songs described as 'Americana'. He is often touted as one of the UK's most overlooked musical treasures.

Thur 14th May. Canadian singer-songwriter **Tara MacLean** has been an internationally renowned and award-winning recording and touring music artist for over 25 years.

Fri 15th May. Vinny Peculiar, with his flat cap, florid blouse and fidgety nervous energy pitched somewhere between Andy Warhol and Jarvis Cocker.

Sat 16th May. Around About Dusk is an original project from Bristol that offers a unique journey through the vibrant fusion of New Orleans jazz, European folk and old-time influences.

Sun 17th May. Iona Lane is a young, upcoming folk singer and musician, whose emotive and well-crafted songs are delivered with immense passion.

Thur 21st and Fri 22nd May. The Rube and Rake sound elides an empathetic vocalist rapport with thoughtful, sometimes playful, acoustic guitar and banjo styling with tender melodies and tight vocals.

Sat 23rd May. Over The Moon are award winning roots/swing multi-instrumentalists/vocalists. Their music is a wild ride from 40's sounding western swing and Appalachian old-time, to cowboy blues.

Sun 24th May. An evening with **Scott Cook**, songwriter and troubadour and his partner Pamela Mae on upright bass, banjo and vocals.

Mon 25th May. Joseph Decosimo is a multi-instrumentalist (fiddle, banjo, drone things) singer, and leading interpreter of traditional music from Southern Appalachia.
