Varley was an English-born Canadian artist who began his career in Nether Edge, studying at the Sheffield School of Art before emigrating to Canada in 1912. He became a founding member of the Group of Seven and served as an official war artist during World War I. He is remembered for his striking portraits and landscapes, and while he spent his later life in Canada, his early life and artistic education in Sheffield provided a crucial foundation for his prolific career. £5 on the door.
