Sun 12th Oct. M G Boulter is a songwriter and musician who currently lives on the outer reaches of the Thames coast and is a long standing member of the Simone Felice Group.

Fri 17th Oct. LunaBarge are a double-stomping, energetic, uplifting indie duo. They are armed with banjo, ukulele, 2 voices and 2 stomp boxes.

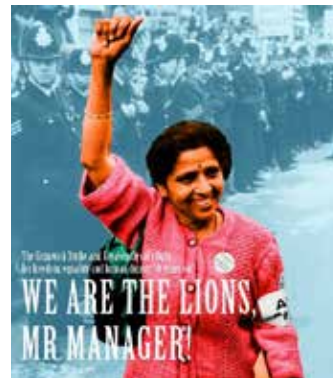
